Psychology Research Methods - Instructions for Paper Rewrite

As stated in the syllabus, students can revise and resubmit the second lab paper to earn back 25% of all paper-points missed. For example, if your grade was 90 out of 120 on Paper 1 and 110 out of 120 on Paper 2, you missed 40 total points. Then, 40 points x = 25% = 10 points, which is the maximum additional bonus points you can score through a thorough revision that addresses all lingering issues from your papers.

Requirements

- Rewrites will be evaluated solely by Mike, not your lab instructor.
- Mike's goal is to see that you put in a good-faith effort. Make it especially easy for him to give you full credit by also turning in the graded, marked-up draft you submitted for Paper 2, along with any grading sheets or other feedback you received from the lab instructor. If the feedback mentions any unresolved issues from Paper 1, make sure to turn in the graded, marked-up draft of your submitted Paper 1 (otherwise, no need). Only include any SPSS Output if there are unresolved statistical matters you need to address.
- Address all of your lab instructor's critiques stated or implied from Paper 2, as well as any lingering issues from Paper 1. For example, if the lab instructor notes APA style issues but only circles the first three mistakes, be sure to fix any other similar mistakes throughout.
- If for some reason, you decided against addressing a critique of the prior draft, you are welcome to type an explanation or simply explain next to the critique in the prior draft.
- If you worked as a pair on the prior draft, you can turn in a rewrite as a team or individually. Be sure to note clearly who should receive credit for the rewrite.
- Turn in the rewrite to Mike by 11:59am on Monday 5/7. You can drop it off to him at Exam 3 or slide it under his office door (Stern 3070) any time before the deadline. Rewrites submitted to other locations, without the prior draft, or after 11:59am will not be accepted, so plan ahead.
